The three things are: Highland Avenue sanitary sewer system—that's about midway in the first page there. We're still waiting on Trumbull County to establish their

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agreement with the City of Warren. We can't proceed with our sanitary sewer project until that agreement is established between the county and the village. So we just received another version today in the email and I think most of you have it.

The public warning system project. That's at Phase 2. We're going to do a site visit later on this week with the contractor in order to get going on that. The shop drawings have been approved. So that means that the equipment is being manufactured for the sirens.

The Layer Road right-of-way issue. We're doing a lot of work behind the scenes trying to find the documents that substantiate the official right-of-ways in that 1998 project. I'm going to work with Solicitor Dutton, see if we can find any more and then report back to Council after that. Until then, I really don't have everything that I can substantiate the right-of-way status.

MR. RADTKA: No report tonight, Mr. Mayor.

MAYOR HILL: Questions for Ron?

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Parks, Buildings, Grounds, General Improvements, Streets and Sidewalks, Mrs. Jones?

MRS. JONES: I have no report. We just have the three items that we'd like to see passed emergency.

MAYOR HILL: I guess Judi had her hand up. Excuse me. Judi, you have the floor.

MS. GENSBURG: I'd like to address this Council again tonight. Back in May, I presented all of you with a packet of information concerning the end of Ina Drive. First in the letter was seeking reimbursement for the end of Ina Drive, the funds that my dad spent to construct it. It contained the information from Dan Lutz, the paver, showing the date of the bill, November 5, 1996, and the drawing at the end of Ina Drive, the portion dad paid to construct. Also, the minutes of Lordstown Planning Commission, December 12, 1994, where Mayor Hill is quoted as saying—he's talking about Ina Drive. "While I heard it has been accepted but the village never did anything to it. And the guy who put it in said, I had to put it in according to your specs and now you're not maintaining it. The Street Department said as soon as there is a house on it as long as the base is there, we're not going to do anything with it." Finally with a map showing what Ina Drive looks like today. The turnaround, as a result of this lawsuit, has been eliminated. This is proof alone that our family did, in fact, own this end portion of Ina Drive even though the magistrate ruled the city built the road and turnaround in 1978 and then maintained it all these years. All of these statements—first of all, the Mayor and lawyer went along with these claims even though they knew it to be false and, hence, the city won its case. They took our land even though I had the deed to this end portion of the land and that this end portion was in Dad's estate. I have lost faith in this city's government. Back in May, our family had asked Council to reimburse some of the money Dad spent for building this end portion in 1996—which they claim since 1978. Dad should not have spent his own money to complete this. No citizen pays for city's work. Hopefully, four months has been sufficient for Council to discuss it with their members. So I have been asked to come again and request an answer. Can we get our due reimbursement? We would like to not go back into litigation if possible. This has taken a toll on me. As a result, I'm having severe health issues due to the stress. There is some part of this you don't understand. Please ask me. Thank you. I'm here to see what the chance is for getting reimburse back.

MR. RADTKA: If I can, Mrs. Gensburg. When we talked last on the phone, a week or so ago, since then, I've spoken with members of Council, the Mayor, Solicitor; and the feelings of this Board and Council and Mayor and the Solicitor is that it has been litigated and has been ruled upon. The village won. It was appealed. The village won, also. So it's the opinion of all of us at this point in time that this situation is done. If you would want to go forward, that's your right to go forward and do what you want, but it's over in our eyes.

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MS. GENSBURG: You won the lawsuit, which was who had ownership of it. Now there's another issue going to go on, getting reimbursed for, you know, having my dad build that. If you owned it in 1978, why did Dad have to put it in? Would you have done that? No. My dad did it because he owned it. Well, now I think that it's fair that we get reimbursed. Do you understand my point of view on that?

MAYOR HILL: Judi, you keep saying that I required your dad to put it in. The Planning and Zoning Commission required your dad to put it in. I am one person. I don't have the right to make your father put in any property. In order for him to sell those lots and put it out, our Zoning Ordinance says there will be either a cul de sac or a turnaround at the end of any one-way street—dead-end street. Your father did what was required by village Ordinance. I never had or spoke to your father or forced him to put a turnaround in. That is per village Ordinance. It wasn't me. That was the entire Planning Commission, the Street Commissioner, anybody else who was sitting here at that time and voted on that. You have been here many times and said the Mayor made my father do this; the Mayor made my father do that. I did not. That was coming from the Planning Commission. Your father, in order to sell lots, had to put a turnaround at the end for either school buses, emergency equipment, Street Department equipment. It wasn't me. You've come here many times and said the Mayor made my father do that. You know, I was—

MS. GENSBURG: My father was in contact with you.

MAYOR HILL: Your father was in contact with me, but he did what was per village Ordinance. And I had very limited contact with your father when he put it in. You seem to want to come after me at every meeting. I sat on the Planning Commission. That was put in per village Ordinance. I didn't make your father put it in. Your father knew that I did not make him put it in. You keep saying, well, you were in contact—

MS. GENSBURG: Well, you—

MAYOR HILL: I got along very well with your father, and I'm not here to debate you, Judi. I'm just telling you the facts. I did not make your father—

MS. GENSBURG: If you owned that land—you claimed you owned that since 1978, then why did you even have to bother with that?

MAYOR HILL: We claimed right-of-way. We claimed right-of-way. We don't have a deed—

MS. GENSBURG: This lawsuit has done away with the turnaround. You don't even understand that.

MAYOR HILL: The people who own the turnaround contacted the village and said, "we want to maintain the turnaround." We have no problem with that. So you sued us and took us to court. You came here and said your Mayor cost you \$20,000 in attorney fees. No, it wasn't me, Judi. This Council and everybody has to approve attorney fees. It's not me. And everybody up here or if it was before, some of these people hadn't been elected yet. They all knew what the consequences were. If this village gets sued, we don't just sit there and say we can't defend ourselves. Now, I believe you've probably spent more on this lawsuit. You've accused us of altering maps. You've

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accused us of misstatements. None of that has occurred.

MS. GENSBURG: I didn't accuse you of altering maps. There's no altering any of the maps. It's what comes from the map department. They are what they are. But I can't believe that—

MAYOR HILL: You took us to Common Pleas Court—

MS. GENSBURG: Whatever, Mayor—

MAYOR HILL: You appealed it to the Court of Appeals. Your attorney was there; our attorney was there.

MS. GENSBURG: Right, and your attorney—

MAYOR HILL: I didn't say anything. Both attorneys represented. They ruled against you.

MS. GENSBURG: Well, the judge asked your attorney, "what is the concern of Lordstown? If this is an issue between two neighbors?"— which somehow that got the connotation not that you went across for the sewers— "what is your concern, Lordstown?" And your lawyer says, "well, we have maintained it all these years." Well, no you haven't. It's proven in the commissioner's minutes. I mean, it's just terrible what this has done to our family. You just can't take people's property like that.

MAYOR HILL: We didn't take it. Your father had given it to us. The court agreed with it. As far as I'm concerned—and I can't speak for the rest of Council—you've taken us to the Common Pleas Court; you've taken us to the Court of Appeals. Your attorney plead the case; our attorney plead the case. As far as I'm concerned, it's done and that's all I have to say on this issue. You can address the rest of Council, Judi.

MS. GENSBURG: So I'm getting a no on this, right? One other thing I'd like to ask Mr. Grimm on the Street Department. Can we get a dead-end sign put on Ina Drive? To keep the traffic—

CHIEF EASTHAM: He had to leave.

MR. BLANK: He had to leave.

CHIEF EASTHAM: He walked out about two minutes ago. He had to go.

MS. GENSBURG: Well, I'd like to address that—

MRS. JONES: I'll talk to him about that.
