And he didn't want to start the drilling for the new poles and whatnot that go along with the project. He didn't want to start that until that's all ready. But he did promise that his schedule, as it was written and distributed to you last month, will be adhered to. So, in essence, he's going to compress his schedule to meet his written schedule.

ATTY. RIES: Thank you. Public remarks. If you'd like to make a public
remark, after I acknowledge you, please come to the
microphone and give your name and address so we can get it
recorded correctly.

MAYOR HILL: Donna Schrader, Lordstown, Ohio. I'd like to know if
anybody knows—there's going to be construction on
Highland Avenue. They've got their equipment there today.
I do know it's Dominion. They contacted me about three
weeks ago. Does anybody know what it is exactly? What
side of the road it's going to be on? Is it the line that was put
in ten years ago? Or is it the one that is vacant right now?

MS. SCHRADER: Have not heard a thing. Dale just said he hasn't been
notified.

MAYOR HILL: They contacted me approximately three weeks ago, Donna,
too, and just asked for permission to work in the road right-
of-way. At that time, it was just for the anodes. The anodes
to protect the lines.

MR. GRIMM:

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MRS. SCHRADER: Well, they've gone up and down the road and they put, like, my pond has the pink markers on. They have other markers for wetlands, things like that. They were looking to have a place to put their pipes that are coming in.

MR. GRIMM: I don't know anything about that.

MRS. SCHRADER: Can they just do that without you or Council or anybody knowing that?

MR. GRIMM: Yeah. We don't regulate public utilities in the road right-of-way.

MRS. SCHRADER: Do you know if the road will be closed?

MAYOR HILL: They would have to let us know if they were going to close the road. They may go to one lane, I would assume. I'm just taking a guess on that one.

MRS. SCHRADER: You wouldn't have any idea how long this is going to be?

MAYOR HILL: They didn't notify me. If they would have notified anybody, it would have been Dale

MRS. SCHRADER: Okay. Thank you.

MAYOR HILL: Any other public remarks.
(NO RESPONSE.)
Hearing none, are there any Council remarks?

MRS. JONES: Yes. At the last meeting, we talked pretty extensively about the road right-of-way on Layer Road. Immediately after the meeting, I called and the safe was gotten into over at my brother's and paperwork was brought to Mr. Blank, and I guess copies were made and sent to the engineer's office. So, I think that part of that is helpful and so forth. But we don't know whether there's anything else in there. That thing is full of paperwork and stuff, that safe. So, if there's things you're still looking for, somebody needs to go with Bill's son and my sister and look at the paperwork that's in there because we don't know.

MAYOR HILL: That's a real good question, Karen. Who would go?

MR. KOGELNIK: If the Board pleases, I can go to the house with one of the Lordstown officials and look for the paperwork that we're looking for. What we're really looking for is that agreement.

MRS. JONES: Uh-huh.

MR. KOGELNIK: That should be it. Because, at the time, everything was done and an agreement was to be signed. The agreement has an exhibit and description of the deed. So, if the Board wishes, I'll tag along with them, and we'll go look through the paperwork. But we are ready to proceed upon the Board's approval.

MRS. JONES: Proceed with?

MR. KOGELNIK: With preparing the rest of the easement exhibits and deed description so that it can be accompanied with an agreement document prepared by the Solicitor's office.

MAYOR HILL: Does anybody have a problem with Mr. Grimm going with Mr. Kogelnik?

MR. GRIMM: Just as long as John or your sister is there, too. I don't want to be going through personal—

MRS. JONES: You'll have to contact John and set up a set time. I don't know that Ruth needs to go, but John would need to be there.

MAYOR HILL: I don't think anybody behind the dais should go. It should be a department head that deals with the roads.

MRS. JONES: Yes.

MR. GRIMM: I just don't want to be there only—

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MRS. JONES: You're not. John would have to be there because he knows how to get in the safe.

MR. GRIMM: Okay.
