Mayor's report. I do have a full-time officer, which I'll be asking Council to confirm. Everybody should have gotten a notice in their box. Police Chief may want to add to that on his report.
Also, been requested by the BPA for summer help for an appointment to the Water Department.
I got a call from Congressman Ryan the other day. He said the Village of Lordstown is getting \$640,000 of the Covid relief money. Supposed to be getting a list of what we can actually use that for. But one thing we can use it for is broadband Internet, stuff like that. In case you're unaware, we have had a lot of problems with our Internet service here with

fire walls and our phones they have been going out. And the way the phone system is set up now, it's all in one room in the Fire Department. So, this may be time where we'll want to try to eliminate one of those problems. If we can, I think we should use some for cruisers and use the balance for matching funds for paving. That's my recommendation to Council. May want to look at that. You know, once we get the parameters of how we're allowed to spend that money, I'll forward it on to the Solicitor and have him take a look at it. As everybody knows, we had three cruisers go out within a couple months. And if you drive around and see our roads, they do need a little bit of work.

This evening I was at Lordstown Motors. Secretary of State Frank LaRose was there. They did give a tour. I left early to get to the meeting. They did show several beta bodies they're starting out. And their goal, once they're wrapping up, is to get one a day. They say they are still on track. I'm sure everybody saw the headlines last Friday. I have no comment on that other than, you know, when I got—I just got several phone calls and I told the media, I said, you know, we didn't grant the abatement. We are still optimistic and things like this with the research company, I guess that's—you know, there's a lot of comments on there, and I don't have enough information on that to proceed with any other comments on that. That's it for the Mayor's report.

Is there a Clerk's report?

MR. BLANK: I have no report, Mayor.

MR. KOGELNIK: Yes. I wanted to update Council that in the BPA meetings we had a pretty good presentation, we think it was, with regard to the master water plan and the water rate study. We think those are both going in the right direction. We're going to be submitting a proposal for the wastewater rate study here coming up after the completion of the water rate study, obviously.

I have learned some new information regarding pavement regarding Hallock Young Road. It is my understanding that the Village actually did get Hallock Young Road between State Rt. 45 and Ellsworth Bailey successfully a couple years ago. That means if you have your design done, you can go to construction and resurface that road next year and get 80 percent of the construction paid for. And it also means that you could apply to OPWC next year and collect another ten percent. That's what they stated today leaving you ten percent that the local share would have to pay for. That's pretty good for a good size road like that. You have some planning to do. I also learned today about some other information with regards to planning that I'd like to talk with Council about at another time. I'll let you decide that.

Board of Public Affairs also has authorized to begin the I&I study, it's a pilot study for a smaller portion of the east side system, that is your pump station No. 2 tributary areas, specifically. So, we're going to be working on that.

I also have discussed with General Motors representatives the topic of going and pursuing additional funding. If you'd like, I can tell that to you now or if you want, I can send it to you in an email. Which do you prefer?

MAYOR HILL:

Let's hear it.

MR. KOGELNIK:

All right. So, I have met with Eastgate officials and based on where we're at today with the projects, what we know about US EDA and the forecast for additional funding, it is not advisable to make another submission for US EDA application for the Ultium project. So, with that said, we're not going to pursue that. But now that Eastgate knows what you're planning to do for your master water plan and you have enough time in front of you for your second phase—let's call it your new 24 inch coming from Niles—you can get in front of that with additional funding support from Eastgate and others. So, there again, you have some initiative to get all of this put in front of you with enough months and years in front of you so that you can submit for funding on that and maybe help out yourself and the developments that come along with that.

So, I wanted to just give you that update, but I also then picked up the phone right after I had that meeting with Eastgate. Mr. Zarella had called me himself, and so I just basically told him what I told you. He's understanding with that right now, reluctantly.

I wanted to just inform you all of what I learned through my meeting with Eastgate. I promised you I would.

here, as well. But I wanted everyone else to know what was happening with regards to that piece of legislation. Hopefully, you don't have any questions, but if you do, I'm happy to answer.

Parks, Grounds, Buildings, Street Superintendent, Mr. Hickox?

MR. HICKOX:

Thank you, Mr. Mayor. On Friday, the 12th, I met in the county Engineer's Office with Steve Gerberry and representatives from Niles, Weathersfield and American Electric Companies. American Electric is looking for a road use agreement with all of the joining towns. Our portion would be Brunstetter, Highland, Salt Springs and Hallock Young. And the purpose of the road use is they're extending a 138 KDA power line to the Ultium Cell facility. They plan to start May/June time frame in the Village here, and they will be done mostly by October. And all their work then will be on site at the Ultium plant.

There were some questions from Niles and Weathersfield on their end that the power company is working out and going to get back to us for another meeting down the road somewhere. It was brought to our attention there's problems with a culvert, a 48-inch cross culvert, near 4328 Highland Avenue, and we've been in contact with the county engineer and they're going to assist us with a bigger piece of equipment than we have and an operator and our crews are going to assist them in replacing that. We're going to have that road closed from Monday, the 22nd, until Wednesday, the 31st.

It was also brought to our attention there's a cross culvert on Route 45 near the Ultium property that's reached the end of its life span. Near as we can figure, it's been there 40 plus years, or whenever the road was widened to four lanes. It's going to need replaced.

In March of 2015, the state implemented what they call the RMR Act. I put a manual in everybody's—the first ten pages of the manual—in everyone's mailbox. The first paragraph sums up where the state thinks we are as far as a Village and why it's our responsibility. On about page 9, it goes down through and it lists culverts, specifically, and if you go across to the Village portion of that, it references the Ohio Revised Code, I believe, four times. So, I have asked the Solicitor to look into that as far as our responsibilities in regard to the Ohio Revised Code.

SOLICITOR DUTTON:

What is the estimated cost of that culvert?

MR. HICKOX:

Approximately, \$100,000.

I would like to thank the Ultium Cell Corporation. They sent over a dozen volunteers, and they helped us with some clean-up efforts. We mulched the building here. We were out and painted the posts on some of the Lordstown signs at the Village limits. They did a great job, and it was a pleasure having them.

I did receive notification that the scrap tire grant was approved for \$1,462, and we will be holding that June 6th through the 11th of this year. That's a Monday through Friday at the Village garage.

That's all I have right now.

MR. BOND: Is there any limit to the tires per resident?

MR. HICKOX: No. We could establish that if we wanted but, at this time, no.

MR. BOND: Okay.

MAYOR HILL: Other questions for Ron?

MR. BLANK: Ron, that Highland Avenue that's going to be closed, is that north of Brunstetter?

MR. HICKOX: Yes, between Brunstetter and Tait. We're going to be out tomorrow putting some signs up ahead of time warning people that it's going to be closed from that date. Hopefully, someone will notice it. We've already talked to police, fire and the schools and we'll let them know the official dates for sure. I just found those out this afternoon.

MR. BLANK: Okay. Thank you.

MAYOR HILL: Any other questions for Ron?

Bill, do we have any correspondence this evening?

SOLICITOR DUTTON: Yes, I've been asked to read this. It's from the Planning and Zoning Office. "Dear Mayor Hill and Members of Village Council: On March 8, 2021, the Lordstown Planning Commission unanimously voted to recommend that Village Council repeal Ordinance No. 94-2010, which had reclassified certain real property, approximately 39.817 acres known as Parcel B on Parcel No. 45-093675, formerly owned by Wendall Orr, et al., currently owned by Robert L. Orr, et al., from Industrial I-1 to Residential R-1. This recommendation comes as a result of the parties' failure to complete the documentation to formally subdivide the real property as it was contemplated in the original zone change, thereby failing to perfect the record." And, I might add—which is not in the letter—I attended that meeting, along with the Mayor, Kellie was there, and the Planning Commission, and it was represented that Mr. Orr, Robert L. Orr, the representative of the family, concurs with the recommendation on the rezoning. So, it's not a contested matter. This is signed Kellie D. Bordner, Planning and Zoning Administrator.

MAYOR HILL: Thank you, Paul. Public remarks. I don't know what's going on with the Internet here, but it says the ethernet does not have a valid IP configuration. But I know last time when this happened people told me when they were on the other side, they still heard the whole meeting. So, we might want to look at getting our Internet fixed. This is the second meeting in a row that something has happened. Are there any public remarks in the audience here?

a facility out here. And they would like me to set up with some of the local businesses—which I will be trying to do this week—where they can come out and explain what they would like to see. I think they'd like to get an urgent care center. It would start out small, like with a family practice, maybe four rooms and an office to start, then possibly build a facility. They said this has been on their radar for about a year, year and a half. And we met with a site consultant, somebody from the clinical staff, somebody from the medical staff, and somebody from the, I'll call it, the financial staff. And they are really interested in putting something here. If I get any more information, I'll pass that on.

So, this would be an hourly fee, not to exceed \$4,000. I would need a motion for that.
