MAYOR WOODWARD: All opposed.

MAYOR WOODWARD: The motion is carried. Mayor's Report. I just want to bring up the community picnic that is coming up next month, Saturday May 16 from 1:00 to 4:00. It will be at -- next to the Fire Station park. I spoke to -- just to update everybody, I did speak to Sgt. Major Persing of the Ohio National Guard the 1192nd Engineer Company. He said that he took it up the chain about the demolition of Kunkel, but he was told that all civilian work is on hold because of a liability issue that they had. I don't know, it sounds like something bad happened and that they're not doing any of that kind of work right now. He said if that changed, he would let us know, but I'm hoping that we'll have something else done with it before, you know, that ever comes to that. And I'm going to be asking for a motion for executive session tonight to discuss appointments and compensation for a police department employee. So, I just want to let you know that's going to be under New Business. Clerk's Report.
CLERK BLANK: I have no report, Mayor.
MAYOR WOODWARD: Solicitor's Report.
ATTY. RIES: Only thing I have, at the last meeting we talked about the E.P.A. decision on the NPDES renewal permit; and we believed that was going to be in the pipeline to be approved by the E.P.A. at that time. We did get the decision on April 10, and I forwarded it to Council that they did -- the E.P.A. did approve the renewal for the discharge from Clean Energy Future Trumbull. There's an appeal right that we have. So, does anybody have any questions for me?
MAYOR WOODWARD: Are we going to do that appeal?

ATTY. RIES: That's --
MAYOR WOODWARD: That's Council's decision. We should probably --
MR. MOSELEY: We need to.
MS. BLANK: I agree.
ATTY. RIES: We have until May. I can go ahead with that, I just need Council approval.
MR. MOSELEY: Yeah, I'd say we need to do it.
MS. BLANK: I agree.
MAYOR WOODWARD: Is there anybody that is not in favor of moving forward with an appeal? All right. Sounds like everybody would be on board with it, so go forward.
ATTY. RIES: Okay.
MAYOR WOODWARD: Anything else?
ATTY. RIES: No, that's all I have.
MAYOR WOODWARD: Treasurer's Report.
MR. EBLING: No report.
MAYOR WOODWARD: Board of Trustees Public Affairs Report.
MR. PETERSON: Yes, Mayor. Our next meeting is tomorrow at 4:00 p.m.
MAYOR WOODWARD: Okay. Village Engineer's Report.
MR. KOGELNIK: Yes, Mayor. I didn't pass out a printed report, but I'll give just some update. On Lyntz Road OPWC has preliminarily scored this project as a 64, and so it has a competitive score going into May when we might hear a decision for funding on this road resurfacing. On Trumbull Energy Center we're pretty much done with anything that has to do with the review except for the Warren water line. That was a separate work authorization, and as you probably remember TEC is paying for that. We continue to stay on the warranty because they told us that they were going to have about a three-week period of site restoration, and so they have had some work out there over the past couple weeks and like every week. We're going to stay in touch with them to make sure that's going. In regard to the RUMA, it -- Bill, what do we have for an agreement with TEC to close off the RUMA?
CLERK BLANK: Are you talking about the curb?
MR. KOGELNIK: Yeah.
CLERK BLANK: 174, I believe.
MR. KOGELNIK: Yeah. Will they issue a check to the Village to close that out?
CLERK BLANK: Yeah. I did get a hold of that Mr. Harvey.
MR. KOGELNIK: Great.
CLERK BLANK: Yep. And he's going to send a check.
MR. KOGELNIK: Okay. Regarding State Route 45 and the shoulders, we have pretty much the first bullet, which is arranging all the old facts from all the old data. So, I have almost all that put together, Mayor, and I'll be sharing that with you and with Matt. And we've taken pictures of the existing shoulders. What we haven't done is identify the safety issues and the last bit, which was for us to prepare a letter on the Village's behalf. So, I actually have a phone call coming from ODOT supposedly today or tomorrow. They had some ideas on the road. I don't know what they're going to have, but I have to listen to them.

Henn Parkway, the drainage issue, I talked to Lamar, I need some help on that. And it sounds like there was a property change just recently there, and so we'll have to review how that impacts everything. No change on the Hallock Young Road MFA. State Route 45 booster station is going to be bid on May 5, 2:00 p.m. in this room. And again, that project involves funding, \$200,000 from ARPA, that's a grant, has to be spent by 9/29/26. And the rest would be mostly from the U.S. E.P.A., \$4.2 million grant and a small -- very small amount for the local share from Lordstown cash. You can't match federal to federal or otherwise we would have. And the project is estimated I think around \$620,000. By the way, the tractor-trailer is moved. Number -- I'm sorry. Repair to the existing air release valve vault out there on Salt Springs Road, that has been done; and so, the air release valve project can probably be closed off. The water meter replacement project will become probably the highest OPWC priority for the Village this year, unless somebody else tells me -- but that's what BPA's decision is and that's what we're going to proceed with by August. I believe that's it. I do have a proposal that's going to be sent to Martin for the turn lane improvement on Ellsworth Bailey Road. Does anybody have any questions for me?

MR. LIMING:

Will that booster station be done by 9/29/26?

MR. KOGELNIK:

Probably not.

MR. LIMING:

So, then what happens?

MR. KOGELNIK:

We're going to spend as much money as we possibly can by 9/29/26, and that money is going to be earmarked for ARPA. I can't say it any more clearly than that.

MAYOR WOODWARD:

Okay. Special Reports, Police Chief Brent Milhoan.

CHIEF MILHOAN:

Mayor, I have no report, but I was asked to read this letter. "On March 28, 2026, the Lordstown Police and Fire Associations hosted their most successful annual Easter egg hunt to date. This year's event saw a record-breaking turnout of 105 local children, the highest attendance in the events history.

Thanks to the incredible generosity of our sponsors and the dedication of our associations, the day was packed with excitement. With 30 large prizes up for grabs every child had the opportunity to win. We purchased eight bikes including 20-inch and 16-inch bikes and four tricycles and offered thirty large prize drawings. Each child received two tickets to enter for the specific prizes they hoped to win. Volunteers filled 2,000 eggs. To keep things fair, we featured 300 special prize eggs split between two age groups, zero through Kindergarten and First Grade and up. In addition to the snacks provided, every child received a chocolate bunny to take home. This tradition of giving chocolate bunnies continues to create special memories for the little ones in our community. A huge thank you to Foxconn for donating a mountain of toys and gift cards for the adult raffle. We also extend our

gratitude to CSX for the toy train donation and the Mahoning Valley Scrappers for the family four pack of tickets. No hunt would be complete without a visit from the Easter Bunny and families enjoyed cookies and juice throughout the festivities. This event remains a free service for all Lordstown children. We are deeply grateful to the residents and local businesses who support our year-round fundraisers. Without your contributions we wouldn't be able to provide these special memories for our residents. In addition to our community festivities, the Lordstown Police and Fire Associations were honored to provide essential support to local families this Easter season. Our mission to serve goes beyond public safety, and this year's outreach highlights the incredible spirit of neighbors helping neighbors. We distributed 25 gift cards each valued at \$50 to local families who needed a little help this holiday season. We are incredibly grateful to UAW 1112 for their massive donation of frozen foods. This contribution was so significant it filled our 25-foot cubic freezer as well as our additional cooler. Families visited the Lordstown police department to pick up boxes of these frozen goods assuring a healthy meal was available for their holiday tables. Our commitment to the residents of Lordstown doesn't end here. We are already working on several new projects for the near future. We need your help. If you know of any resident currently in need of food or assistance, please let us know. You can contact any dispatcher or officer, and they will ensure the information gets to the right person so help can be provided. A huge thank you to the residents and businesses who continue to support our fundraisers by making these services possible. Together we are making Lordstown a stronger more caring community. MAYOR WOODWARD: Thank you, that was very nice. Does anybody have any questions for the Chief? Okay. Fire Chief Travis Eastham.

CHIEF EASTHAM: No report tonight, Mayor.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Does anybody have any questions for the Fire Chief? Planning and Zoning Administrator Kellie Bordner.

MS. BORDNER: Mayor, I just wanted to share that we do have a Planning Commission meeting coming up on May 11 at 6:30. I know it's a little early to say this, but -- and we'll have one more Council meeting and I'll remind everyone -- but the exciting part of that is that we have a gentleman who's looking to re-open Pizza Joe's in the Lordstown Plaza, and he will be at this Planning Commission meeting. And they are going to have delivery, so that's very exciting as well. And in addition to that, we will have CSX TDSI coming back for an additional site plan review to update their previous site plan which occurred in September of 2025.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Okay. Any questions for Kellie?
Parks/Grounds/Buildings/Streets Superintendent
Martin Nelder.

MR. NELDER: Yes, Mayor. The Road Department, we've been
trying to keep up with all the flooding in the
Village, and we've had trees even uprooting because
the ground is so saturated. In the park they've been
busy trying to get the fields ready, baseball fields,
but the weather's not cooperating too well. So, I
just want to let people know that. And we -- I was
contacted by the soccer organization. They want to
have tournaments during the Apple Cider Festival
Thursday, November -- or Thursday, September 24
through Sunday, September 27. They just wanted
our permission.

MAYOR WOODWARD: It doesn't conflict with anything that we have going
on at the park?

MR. NELDER: No.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Does anybody have a problem with that?

MR. NELDER: All right. I'll let them know.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Okay. Go ahead.

MR. NELDER: That's all I have.

MAYOR WOODWARD: That's all you have? Any updates on the elevator
or the bathroom situation?

MR. NELDER: I'm waiting on quotes for the elevator. They were
out Friday. And last time they said that door
sensor was \$5,000 and that was like last year, so I'm
sure it's going to be a lot more this year.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Oh?

MR. NELDER: Yep. And I'm still waiting on the quote for the
drains for the admin too.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Okay.

MR. NELDER: We tried to jackhammer the floor out, and it is
pretty hard concrete stuff. So, I talked to a
contractor, and they can line it and give us a 40-year
warranty, but he's going to give me a price.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Okay.

CLERK BLANK: Martin, can you get a lift chair for the steps?

MS. BORDNER: Why not just get a conveyer belt.

MAYOR WOODWARD: It would be a good time to move to the library
building since this one's falling apart. Does anybody
have questions for Martin? Correspondence?

CLERK BLANK: No correspondence, Mayor.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Public Remarks. Are there any public remarks?
Hearing none we'll move on. Are there any Council
remarks?

MS. BLANK: I forgot last meeting that a resident had contacted
me about Travis and his department, and she was on
vacation with all the flooding. I e-mailed everyone.
They're new to the area. They moved here from
Newton Falls. She said she was just very impressed;
they literally talked to her on Facetime and helped
her parents get everything situated and came back
later that evening. They're very thankful for you
guys. So, thank you.

MAYOR WOODWARD: All right. Anybody else? I'll move on to Committee
Reports. Finance, Jessica Blank.

MS. BLANK: I have -- just want to see the pieces of the
resolutions be approved tonight. And then I was

contacted by Alexander's Pest Control. Mosquito spraying or fogging will be June 16, July 16, August 19, and September 10. And that will -- I don't know, Kellie, can we put that on the website?

MS. BORDNER: Run through that again with me.

MS. BLANK: Yep. June 16, July 16, August 19, and September 10.

MS. BORDNER: Thank you.

MS. BLANK: Anyone who was on the do-not-spray list you are still on the do-not-spray list, please don't call them. Thank you.

MAYOR WOODWARD: I'm sure they appreciate that.

MS. BLANK: Yeah. They are very agitated with us.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Parks, Buildings, Grounds, General Improvements, Streets and Sidewalks, Jamie Moseley.

MR. MOSELEY: I have no report tonight.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Public Safety and Police Department, Robert Bond.

MR. BOND: I have no report this evening, Mayor.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Public Safety, Fire and EMS, Lamar Liming.

MR. LIMING: Yes. We have one piece of legislation I'd like you to pass emergency tonight.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Okay. Public Utilities, Mark McGrail.

MR. McGRAIL: Yes. Since joining Council and becoming chair of Public Utilities, I've had the opportunity to attend several Board of Public Affairs meetings. And one of the important topics of discussion at those meetings has been the 24-inch redundant water line and having Utility Committee recommend to this body that it apply for funding.

MAYOR WOODWARD: So, we had a work session or a joint meeting with the BPA and the Utility Committee just a couple of days ago. And so right now Council needs to make a decision on whether or not they want to apply for funding for a loan for this project.

MR. McGRAIL: Well, at the -- and we were going to -- we were working towards making that recommendation to Council. However, there was one question that went unanswered, and the information is supposed to be provided to us at the -- we're going to have one other meeting on May 1. And hopefully at that meeting we'll be making that recommendation.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Okay. All right. Anything else? Do you have anything else?

MR. McGRAIL: I'm sorry. No.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Planning and Zoning, Ron Radtka.

MR. RADTKA: The only thing I have, Mayor, is the next Mobile Market will be on the 26th of this month from 11:30 to 1230 over at Imperial. That is it.

MAYOR WOODWARD: It's at Imperial? Is there one here?

MR. RADTKA: We already had it last week. So that will finish out April.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Okay. Mark, did you want to do any updates with the Moratorium Committee?

MR. McGRAIL: Just very quickly.

MAYOR WOODWARD: I'll give you the floor.

MR. McGRAIL: Thank you. We're going to be having a meeting here in the near future. Planning and Zoning Committee has been working on some issues with regards to certain uses in the Village which I

believe were going to also come under the Moratorium Committee. And in talking with Brian Frantz, the consultant, felt it would be a good idea that it be a collaborative effort between Planning and Zoning, and we've also talked about that, where because in the end whatever we develop is going to have to be passed through Planning and Zoning. So, I believe you're going to hear about some of these things here shortly.
