MR. BLANK: No report, Mayor.
MAYOR HILL: Solicitor's report?
ATTY. RIES: No report, Mayor.
MAYOR HILL: Treasurer's report?

MR. EBLING: No report.

MAYOR HILL: Board of Trustees of Public Affairs report?

MR. PETERSON: Yes, Mr. Mayor. I know the Utility Committee and you and

a couple other people were at our meeting last week

assessing funding for the projects and everything. We have a list of the projects we're working on. So, we're working on them. Councilman Bond and I met before that meeting, actually, and made a couple phone calls. We were kind of

talking back and forth with the Mahoning County

Commissioners, trying to get some dialogue there for the Utility Committee so we can work on the Antonine Sisters. And that water service was passed by the BPA last month, so

we were good with it.

We do have a meeting coming up on the 18th, our regular meeting. Then we have a meeting with the Utility Committee and MVSD and BPA on the 13th to start working on the 24-

inch line.

MR. BOND: And I'd think anybody from Council is welcome there, too,

right?

MR. PETERSON: Absolutely. Everybody is welcome. And we did receive a

letter from Newton Falls for support for some of our projects. Councilman Bond and I did reach out to North Jackson. They're working on a letter. And we're obviously

going to ask the commissioners for one.

That's all I have unless anybody has any questions.

MAYOR HILL: Any questions for Chris?

(NO RESPONSE FROM COUNCIL.)

Thank you.

MR. PETERSON: Thank you.

MAYOR HILL: Village Engineer's report?

MR. KOGELNIK: I submitted a written report to Council and just wanted to go

over a couple items real quick. Thank you all for—those of you who did attend the funding meeting last week. I thought that we had some good questions and comments exchanged during that. It's good to hear Chris is working with the Utilities Committee to list out projects of priority. That's

where it starts, the priorities.

One thing that we've worked on over the past couple months has been your resurfacing of Ellsworth Bailey Road. Last week we heard that that project's bid was opened up and it came in underneath the estimate that we had initially made. And what that also means is that not all of your OPWC funding will have had to have been spent. On one hand that's good; but on the other hand, you don't want to return a lot of your grant money. So we'll have to work that out and see what we can do there.

The one thing we did talk about at your meeting last week with the BPA was that almost all of your top four water projects have funding identified for them, nominated. That

doesn't mean committed. Committed means you've already made a final application to whomever and you're on the hook for a local share.

So, right now you've got all of your priorities covered. I wouldn't stop here. I would keep going with funding to try and offset whatever local share you've got. That's the trick. But we're handling right now a couple delicate issues, this Henn Park drainage issue and Lipkey Road waterline. I know we'll get through them eventually, but it's going to take some time probably to do that. I know that we have a work authorization for the Henn Parkway drainage issue on your agenda tonight.

Does Council have any questions for me?

I've got one. Let them know about the dialogue with Ultium

over the temporary traffic signals.

MR. KOGELNIK: Thank you. Last week we got comments from ODOT on our

temporary signal design. Because the span is so big, they wanted to see different ways to guide the poles. We have a U-shape configuration right now that we're considering at that intersection to temporarily brace span wire for the signals at that intersection. So, we're addressing those comments for ODOT right now. And then the plan right after that is to get the instructions for the preliminary design of the temporary signals over to Main Light so that they can hurry up and get those up.

I just had a phone call with Miss Jody Sexton. Is that her name?

MAYOR HILL: Yes, correct.

MAYOR HILL:

MR. KOGELNIK: I think she's in charge of HR from Ultium. And she's very concerned with the safety at that driveway. I'll be honest

with you, when I'm sitting there looking at the traffic coming out of there, there are times when those cars don't stop. They just roll. They make a rolling turn left or right. That's very concerning. They have a stop sign there, and they've actually painted themselves a stop bar on their driveway. I don't know if the stop bar and stop sign are in the correct position though. Jody asked if we could send her the correct positioning from the MUTCD manual. So I asked our traffic engineers if it would be okay to send that to her. But, anyways, I did update her this morning on that. She sounded appreciative but she also sounds concerned, genuinely.

MAYOR HILL: Any questions for Chris?

MR. RADTKA: Yeah, Chris. On your Number 6, your roof replacement

project.

MR. KOGELNIK: Yes.

MR. RADTKA? We can't do a modified truss. We've got to go in-kind—MR. KOGELNIK: Yeah, based on the information that we've reviewed with

Ron—there's actually a lack of information on the buildings to determine whether or not the trusses would work—but we feel that right now based on what we see with the building through the inspection that we did do with our architect, we couldn't put a truss system across the admin building and the police station. So, we're going to go with the replacement inkind, so flat roof. That's not what I would want. Obviously, we were hoping to do that differently, but the distributed

load from the roof has to, you know, be supported by the end

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walls there.

MAYOR HILL: I did give Jamie, who chairs that committee, a copy of the

Garland Company report which we had originally that showed the shape of our roof when Ron had had somebody

come out.

MR. KOGELNIK: Yeah, we have that.

MAYOR HILL: So I turned it over to Jamie because that comes under his

committee.

MR. KOGELNIK: Yep.

MAYOR HILL: Any other questions for Chris?

(NO RESPONSE FROM COUNCIL.)

Thank you very much.

Special reports. Police Chief Milhoan?

CHIEF MILHOAN: Yes, Mr. Mayor. I've submitted my monthly report for

March, answer any questions if you have any.

The only other thing I have is you may or may not know this but when we took ownership of the five Tahoes, the Chevy Tahoes, we decided it would be best to store them up at the Kunkel building for a couple reasons. They were in a heated building. We really didn't have the room behind the station because of the other cars. But it got to the point with the leaking of the roof that we had to pull those vehicles out of there because the ceiling tiles and the parts of the ceiling were falling down, and we didn't want them to damage the cars.

So, I just want to make sure you're aware of the condition of that roof up there at the Kunkel building. It's bad. I don't know what your ultimate plans are to do with that

building. It's really not a place that we could park something

in there that we wouldn't want to get damaged. So, just

wanted to pass that on to you.

MAYOR HILL: Thank you. Any questions for Brent?

(NO RESPONSE FROM COUNCIL.)

Fire Chief Eastham?

CHIEF EASTHAM: Yes, Mr. Mayor. Last week we were notified by the State

Fire Marshall's office that we received two grants. One is an equipment grant for \$5,963.61 and the other one is for a total of five Marx radios and that one totaled \$14,960. They are zero match to the Village. And we did get the two hydraulic cylinders off of the ladder tower that needed rebuilt thanks to Ron's guys at the Road Department and a couple of my guys. It took us about two hours to get them down and off of there and sent to be rebuilt. He did call me back with a price. It was about \$4,600 as opposed to the \$24,000 that they estimated it would be at Atlantic Fire. So, they should be back by Thursday or Friday. He said we should see them

back hopefully and then we'll put them back on.

MAYOR HILL: Any questions for Travis?

(NO RESPONSE FROM COUNCIL.)

Yeah, that little bit of work there saved us quite a bit of

money. Thank you.

Planning and Zoning Administrator, Kellie?

MS. BORDNER: Thank you, Mayor. May 1st has been established for a

public hearing at 5:30 immediately prior to the Council meeting regarding a zone change for TEC on one parcel.

MAYOR HILL: Any questions for Kellie?

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(NO RESPONSE FROM COUNCIL.)

Thank you.

Parks, Grounds, Buildings, Street Superintendent, Mr.

MR. HICKOX: Thank you, Mayor. The Village has been awarded a scrap

tire grant from the Geauga/Trumbull Solid Waste District in the amount of \$3,442. We usually have our scrap tire drop off the middle of June, so we set the date as June 12th through the 16th at the Street Department, as always, from 7 am to 2 pm. The maximum is six tires per household, no rims, no semi tires, tractor or commercial tires.

We've been busy the last couple weeks with downed trees and cleanup.

We made multiple roof repairs on our building and the Water Department building and up at the parks, the shingles have been blown off.

Dominion East Ohio has finished relocating the line on Hallock-Young Road and the contractor has ordered the pipe for the culvert replacement. And it should be delivered on the 18th of April, and he plans on starting shortly after that depending on asphalt, when the plants open up. That's all I have.

MAYOR HILL: Thank you. Any questions for Ron?

MR. MCGRAIL: Mark McGrail, 3656 Goldner Lane, Lordstown, Ohio. Over

the last year or so in talking to residents, I've heard questions about, you know, activities and other, you know, issues in the community. I mean, for instance, I came to you several months ago with regards to the pond and doing something there. And, of course, Travis has taken care of that issue for

One of the other issues are activities for the young people in the community, one of them being Fun Days. I sent an email here, I believe, last week on Monday or Tuesday with regard to that also to be expanded into any number of programs for our youth, including we used to have a fishing derby. And that doesn't look like that may occur this year. I realize—or I don't know the extent or everything that it would take to organize all of this. I realize that the Rec Department is either dormant or non-existent right now and would have to be re-established.

There would be the issue of personnel perhaps for the Rec Department. My thing was—and, also, it was mentioned to me the timeline like on Fun Days, that, generally, was in July. Getting everything done in that time frame might be unrealistic.

What my thought was, more or less, is to somehow assist the Village in bringing these programs back. More than anything else, I think a discussion with Council members and others on how we can bring it back, whatever that means. So, for instance, we have the senior center now—

MR. BLANK:

and people that I've spoken with about Fun Days, you know, the cost and all that—we have no employees. It's all volunteers. And my suggestion to the people who have come to me with regard to this issue is I think that it can be done with the right organization with volunteers.

And one of the reasons, of course, that I come here is money. But, also, in the back of my mind, I'm thinking maybe another avenue for this is to solicit private funds. One of the issues, though, that you run into when you do something of this nature—and I've already talked to insurance agents about it—is the insurance. It's not tremendously prohibitive in cost. I think it can be done. But it comes down to responsibility for something, especially of this nature, especially when you're dealing with young people. And in the past, you know, of course, the Village took care of the insurance because it was your program.

More than anything else—and, oh, by the way, somebody did ask me about interest. I had some help. And we placed a survey online. Within four days, we had 182 positive responses. I went through the list to make sure, you know, there was no double—people putting their name in three and four times and things of that nature. And also to see people that I knew were parents so that you didn't have a bunch of people that were saying yes just to say yes and there's not going to be any benefit for the families. You'd be surprised how many of those 182 are parents.

So, there is an interest. It's a matter of just the will to get it done. I'm just asking Council, and I don't know how to go about it with you guys because it's your venue here how to proceed. I'd like to see Fun Days brought back and perhaps the fishing derby and maybe some other stuff going into the fall. A lot of that has to do with planning.

Just real quick. Fun days, as I was speaking to a mother the other day, I said you do realize that we may not have the ability to bring that back in full this year. We may have to do it for just one week. There are plenty of organizations that I know, even here in Trumbull County, their youth activities are a week. So, we might be able to do something along those lines.

But, again, you've got to get the discussion going. So, I think you all know how to get ahold of me. If you're interested, let me know.
