MAYOR WOODWARD: Second by Bond. Any questions on the bills? All in favor?

MAYOR WOODWARD: All opposed.
(No response.)
MAYOR WOODWARD: The motion is carried. Mayor's Report. Tonight, we have one resignation to accept, one new hire for the Fire Department. And I just wanted to briefly mention that Mark and I had attended an informational session at the Regional Chamber regarding data centers, and it was a very informative session I would say and probably non-partisan in that it really wasn't trying to sway you one way or the other. It was pretty neutral. And Mark and I are trying to share that -- we've shared that information with Council members, just some notes that I had taken in the slides, so hopefully everybody was able to look through those. But if you're interested, I can reach out to Zachary and have him join us maybe -- I'm going to ask him if he would be interested in joining us like in a caucus session if you guys have questions. For him, maybe that's something that he would do because he is in Indiana. Do you think that would be beneficial, would you have questions that you would want to ask, or did you see anything on those slides that you didn't understand that I can have him, you know, maybe clarify? Do you think that this would be beneficial? I mean, it really was neutral. It really was not trying to sway us one way or another, it was just trying to give us the information that we needed to make good decisions and, you know, zoning changes, things like that, to help us get ahead of things instead of being behind and reactive. So, is that something that you guys might be interested in? If not, you can say no, I don't want to waste anybody's time, but --

MR. MOSELEY: No, I don't need to see any of that. Do you guys?
MAYOR WOODWARD: Even if it helps you make a better-informed decision is really what I'm going for, just to make sure that we're making informed decisions with hard facts. So, I mean, it's just to -- I mean, any kind of questions that you might have for him, you know. He's been there, he's done that, he's seen the data centers, he's worked with them. It's up to you. What do you think, Mark?

MR. McGRAIL: I enjoyed his presentation. He was very informative and very engaging. You were able to ask questions as he went through it. So, I think -- I think people will maybe be surprised. You might think off-hand you don't need to see that or I know, but once you start seeing the presentation I will think that --

MAYOR WOODWARD: Yeah. All right. I mean, I will ask him. I don't know if it's something that he would do, but it just -- you know, something if you guys were interested in. If not him then, you know, maybe somebody else. Matt, did you have somebody that you knew maybe?

ATTY. RIES: I had a consultant that we brought up at the last Moratorium Committee meeting.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Okay.

ATTY. RIES: We've been considering reaching out to him for his expertise in dealing with data centers and zoning issues.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Even something like that, just somebody who has the expertise to bring that in to help you make informed decisions I think is what is important. So --

MR. RADTKA: Well Mark, do you think it would be beneficial -- being you and the mayor sat through that presentation, do you think that would be beneficial for the rest of Council to be exposed to that?

MR. McGRAIL: For me it was because you don't know if -- first of all, I don't know everything there is to know about the data center and the pros and the cons. So, there was a lot of information for thought, you know, because eventually we're going to have to have that decision -- or discussion here in Lordstown about data centers. It would be better if you had more information than less. And like I said he was very engaging. He did ask questions too, and the information was pretty much straightforward.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Yeah. I wouldn't say that it was biased at all. I mean, it was very factual and made sense. Even we asked questions about, you know, abatements. And he was honest; he said yes, most of these data centers have asked for 100 percent abatements. You know, and then if that's the case, then what can you do to offset that if that's really what they want. It's going to be a negotiating process. So, you know, there were things like that that he said, and he was very forthcoming with information like that. So, I'd like to set that up. If not him then maybe, you know, somebody else but just -- just to be able to say that we have done that, we understand a data center, you know, we get where they're coming

from and know what questions to ask I think is what is important, knowing which questions to ask when they're in front of you. So -- all right. That's all that I have. Clerk's Report.

CLERK BLANK: No report.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Solicitor's Report.

ATTY. RIES: The only thing I would add to what you just said is we do have a case, you know, with the data center pending in Ohio Supreme Court right now. There's nowhere to appeal depending on how the Ohio Supreme Court rules. If for some reason the Ohio Supreme Court disagrees with our position, having that presentation may be beneficial to the Village to be kind of ahead of the game at the table with the data center rather than trying to play catch-up if we have to comply with an order of the Supreme Court. Because there's a number of things the Supreme Court can do, we would at least be kind of ahead of the game at that point depending on when the Supreme Court rules.

MAYOR WOODWARD: I didn't even think about that. Yeah. We won't have much time to react if that's the case.

MR. RADTKA: Maybe you better set something up.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Yeah, I'll reach out to him to see. All right. Anything else?

ATTY. RIES: No, that's all I have.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Okay. Treasurer's Report.

MR. EBLING: No report.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Board of Trustees of Public Affairs Report.

MR. PETERSON: Yes. Thank you, Mayor. We have a meeting between MVSD, Niles, and us and the Utility Committee tomorrow at 2:00 p.m. And our next regular meeting is March 3.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Okay.

MR. PETERSON: And we may have a special meeting in between there, we're not sure yet.

MAYOR WOODWARD: But tomorrow is a special meeting?

MR. PETERSON: Correct.

MAYOR WOODWARD: At 2:00 p.m.?

MR. PETERSON: Yes.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Okay. Village Engineer's Report.

MR. KOGELNIK: Thank you, Mayor. I distributed a written report to everybody. As Chris said, we'll be participating in that meeting tomorrow at 2:00 p.m. with everybody. We have a number of -- we have one project that's going into construction, it's going to be advertised soon, that's the water booster station. Matt, is there any update on the master funding agreement with Foxconn?

ATTY. RIES: So I spoke to the attorneys about what we discussed, removing -- giving us control over the project basically and setting it up as a more streamlined funding mechanism. And they were -- the attorneys were okay with that approach because it creates less obligations for them and it gives us more control anyway. So, I've revised the agreement and I sent it over to them, and they are reviewing it.

MR. KOGELNIK: All right. Thank you. We still need to complete that RUMA for TEC. And I haven't heard anything from Mr. Harvey, so I'm probably going to be reaching out to him again to talk about that. And we've done everything that's needed on the Lyntz Road resurfacing project by submitting the OPWC Small Governments information, so that one is going on the right track. On State Route 45 for the shoulders, Lamar, we recently heard that ODOT is pulling back HSIP funding. So, we were thinking we could utilize that HSIP funding in conjunction with OPWC funding to redo that. We're going to have to find another funding program to meet up with the OPWC, so that's happening.

MR. LIMING: How much was OPWC going to pay or could they pay?

MR. KOGELNIK: Typically on a project like that -- this one involves reconstruction probably of those shoulders, it might get a few more points -- you're probably looking at 40 percent. So, we'll have to -- we'll have to do traffic counts, we'll have to really get some support on that from the neighboring commercial establishments, which I know we can. ODOT -- or I'm sorry, Ohio State Capital Budget is now available. The due date is March 12. So, I've looked at a number of projects that we've, you know, been thinking about over the past couple years, namely the State Route 45 shoulders, even the second phase of the 24-inch water line Chris, and even the five sanitary sewer extensions. Unfortunately, the State Capital Budget is not eligible for that. State Capital Budget is for a lot of recreation, parks, and that sort of thing. So, if that's something that you are interested in, I can send that to you. It really deals with community improvements rather than rebuilding infrastructure or anything like that. But I can send you the one-page sheet that shows what is eligible, what is not, and you can determine for yourself. But right now, I don't see anything unless you really want to do something with your parks. At one point in time, you did. So, that's all I have for my report. Are there any questions for me?

MR. LIMING: What is valve number four on there? Is that one of those new valves that we're repairing already?

MR. KOGELNIK: It is, yep.

MR. LIMING: Why is that?

MR. KOGELNIK: It happened last month, Lamar. The valve body cracked again.

MR. LIMING: It froze or pressure cracked it?

MR. KOGELNIK: We do not know. We suspect it was a forging with the casting because it cracked at the same location on the valve body. So, we've already got that being addressed by the valve manufacturer. The replacement valve I think has been delivered to the contractor, Kirila Construction, and they are to be installing that. This is for the air release valve just east of the railroad tracks on Salt Springs Road.

MR. LIMING: So, what is the warranty on that?

MR. KOGELNIK: One year.

MR. LIMING: What, just the valve and we got to pay to do all the replacement and anything --

MR. KOGELNIK: We don't have to do anything. It's within the warranty.

MR. LIMING: Okay.

MR. KOGELNIK: So that's the beauty of going through a public construction contract, and that's kind of why we mentioned doing that for Hallock Young Road. You're under a traditional delivery; you have terms and conditions that you can rely on. And sometimes if you want you can make that warranty period two years. So, you know, it really requires some -- (inaudible) -- you want to do an infrastructure project, it's specific kind of equipment.

MR. LIMING: Very good.

MR. KOGELNIK: Thank you.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Special Reports. Police Chief Brent Milhoan.

CHIEF MILHOAN: I have no report tonight, Mayor.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Fire Chief Travis Eastham.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Planning and Zoning Administrator Kellie Bordner.

MR. NELDER: Yes, Mayor. I talked to Jeremy Cole from Cole Creative Design about the veterans' flags. We wanted to get that started earlier this year. We wanted to start it February 25 through April 24. The veterans' flags will be \$80.06, which is the same price as last year. If any resident wants to purchase one, I have the information, they can contact me and I'll give them all the information to contact Cole. And then we'll hang them up for Memorial Day through -- Memorial Day through Labor Day we'll hang them. That's all I have.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Okay. And then can I get a copy of that application, I'll put it out on social media and --

MR. NELDER: Sure.

MS. BLANK: Will they be two-sided again?

MR. NELDER: Yeah, they are two-sided.

MS. BLANK: I was just asking.

MR. NELDER: I don't know what happened with that.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Okay. There's no option to make them --

MR. NELDER: I can check.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Could it be two-sided with the same person on both sides so that you can see it going either way?

MS. BLANK: Two-sided with both your family members on one.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Okay. I think that the family members want the flags, and I think that's why.

MR. NELDER: Yeah, I understand.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Okay. Check on that for me.

MS. BLANK: No one likes sharing, Martin.

MR. NELDER: I'll check.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Thank you. Correspondence.
