MAYOR WOODWARD: Motion is carried.
Mayor's report. I just emailed to all of Council and the Clerk an email that I got. This is the result of the Phase II assessment for the Kunkle property. That is completed. You guy had authorized that back in the fall sometime. They did their Phase I. They determined what they wanted to move on to Phase II, which they did. They did the ground water study, and it came back that there were no findings. So there's nothing, no contamination to speak of and no need for remediation.
Now, I did ask them about funding for demolishing the building, which I know excites Jessica. (Laughter.) They cannot use the Brownfield money for the demolition. So, I went back, and I asked Ashley again about that. She is looking to see if the funding can be used on a partial demolition. It wouldn't be the whole building. She's going to get back with me about that.
The report is in your email. And I did ask Dustin to put the report on the website at some point in time so that that can be for public viewing.
Tonight I also like to commend Dispatcher Eric Emerine, Dispatcher Erich Luketic, Officer Tom Robinson and Officer Charles Mendenhall. We got an email today, which Council has seen, on their quick work and response to a situation on Bane Street in Warren Township regarding what I think was a possible abduction from my understanding. So their efforts were commended by Chief Harrell of Warren Township. Also, tonight I will have a request for one appointment for the Water Department for summer help. That is all that I have.
Is there a Clerk's report?
MR. BLANK: No report, Mayor.
MAYOR WOODWARD: Is there a Solicitor's report?
SOLICITOR RIES: No report, Mayor.
MAYOR WOODWARD: How about a Treasurer's report?
MR. EBLING: No report.
MAYOR WOODWARD: What about the Board of Trustees of Public Affairs?
MR. PETERSON: Yes, Mayor. Thank you. Our next regular meeting is tomorrow at 4 p.m.
We are finishing up the grinder pump inspections that I

brought up at the last Council meeting.
The hydrant at Highland Avenue and Yerke-Young is scheduled to be repaired on Thursday of this week.
And, also, now that the weather has broke, our department is going to be out working on landscaping. We're working with the Road Department on their equipment. So, thank you very much.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Thank you.
Village Engineer's report?

MR. KOGELNIK: Yes, Mayor. I've distributed a written report to everybody. We do have some land development plan review efforts coming up, especially for TDSI and possibly Foxconn. So we will be submitting new task orders for that. If there's any other questions, I can answer them. Thank you.

MAYOR WOODWARD: I wanted to touch on the fact that our funding request did not make it through for Joyce's office.

MR. KOGELNIK: Joyce.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Yes. So—

MR. KOGELNIK: Did we check? Did we follow up with Joyce on that?

MAYOR WOODWARD: I did not.

MR. KOGELNIK: Because there were only 11 projects listed in that que, and they said 14—

MAYOR WOODWARD: Right.

MR. KOGELNIK: —were going to be selected.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Okay, so do you think that there's—oh, go ahead, Chris.

MR. PETERSON: I did follow up with them and asked them that question. They were going to look into it and get back with me. I did not hear back.

MAYOR WOODWARD: The way that I understood that email was that it was done. So, we're out.

MR. PETERSON: That's the way I kind of understood, too, but he said he'd look into it and let me know.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Okay. Anybody have any questions for Chris?
(NO RESPONSE FROM COUNCIL.)
We'll move on to special reports. Police Chief Brent Milhoan?

CHIEF MILHOAN: Yes, Mayor. I've submitted my report this afternoon for the month of May. Attempt to answer any questions if you have any.
The only other thing I have, you mentioned the appointment for the Water Department. There should also be an appointment for the Police.
Resignation.

MS. BLANK: I missed it.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Shane Smith effective June—

MS. BLANK: That was a resignation. You should have an appointment for Ronald Reed, as well.

CHIEF MILHOAN: I've never seen that one.

MR. BOND: That was last week.

MS. BLANK: I missed it.

MAYOR WOODWARD: I emailed it last week.

CHIEF MILHOAN: You know how many emails a day I get? (Laughter.) So, it's the appointment of Ronald Reed, effective?

MAYOR WOODWARD: Effective pending his medical examination.

CHIEF MILHOAN: Okay. Sorry about that. I do have the resignation of Shane

on here though.
Does anybody have any questions for Brent?
(NO RESPONSE FROM COUNCIL.)
Fire Chief Travis Eastham?
CHIEF EASTHAM: No report tonight.
MAYOR WOODWARD: Planning and Zoning Administrator, Kellie Bordner?
MS. BORDNER: Thank you, Mayor. We have a Planning Commission meeting next Monday, June 9, at 6:30 p.m. There are two replats on the agenda for consideration, along with two zone changes.
MAYOR WOODWARD: Is that it?
MS. BORDNER: Yes, ma'am.
MAYOR WOODWARD: Does anybody have any questions?
(NO RESPONSE FROM COUNCIL.)
Okay, we'll move on to Parks, Grounds, Buildings, Street Superintendent, Martin Nelder?
MR. NELDER: Yes, Mayor. I wanted to let you guys know we received the Veterans' flags today around 2:00, so we're going to get those put up tomorrow.
And June 10th through the 17th, we're having the scrap tire collection back here by the salt dome, eight tires per household.
The road striping should be taking place in about three weeks. I talked to Aero—Mark. He's booked three weeks out but he's got us on the schedule.
And last thing is, Brittany Housel is here tonight to talk in public comments about some baseball tournaments. She wanted to present it to Council. That's all I have.
MR. BLANK: Martin, that striping, you know these roads we bid out to be paved, is the striping in those bids?
MR. NELDER: The housing projects will have the—
MR. BLANK: Can you wait until we get them paid?
MR. NELDER: There's no stripes in there.
MR. BLANK: In none of them?
MR. NELDER: No.
MR. BLANK: Okay. Thank you.
MR. NELDER: Yep.
MAYOR WOODWARD: Any other questions for Martin?
(NO RESPONSE FROM COUNCIL.)
We'll move on then to correspondence.
MR. BLANK: No correspondence.
MAYOR WOODWARD: I have a letter that was from David DeChristofaro. It was dated May 2nd. I didn't think to read it into the record, but I wanted to tonight just so everybody is understanding of his decision. It's dated May 2, 2025, regarding the Trumbull County Council of Governments. "Dear Mayor Jackie Woodward: I recently received a request for clarification as to the assistance this office can legally provide to our townships, villages, cities and the Trumbull County Council of Governments. After consultation with our County Prosecutor's Office, I am now able to provide you with some clarification.
As Trumbull County Engineer, it is part of my statutory duty to work closely with the townships and assisting them with their needs for technical and construction support for such things as highways, culverts and bridges.

Our Prosecutor's Office has advised that this office may also complete survey work for townships' cemeteries under a contract in accordance with R.C. 9.482 B(1.) As it relates to our villages, cities and the COG, I am more than willing to assist with your road projects, as well. However, I was advised by our Prosecutor's Office as follows: 'Going forward, if a municipality, village or the COG requests your office's services, then the legal counsel for the municipality, village or the COG must provide a written legal opinion to you and our office that sets forth the legal basis authorizing your office to complete the requested work.' Furthermore, our Prosecutor's Office advised that, 'legal opinions do not contain any supporting legal authority, such as statute, case law, opinions of the Ohio Attorney General, etc. And well-reasoned arguments in support of your office completing the requested work will be summarily rejected and not considered by our office.'

I understand that this office may have done work under the previous engineer for cities and villages through the COG. However, based on the opinion of our Prosecutor's Office, doing so is at the risk of civil litigation. While I am more than willing to assist with your needs, we must follow the advice of our Prosecutor's Office as outlined in this letter. I trust that this letter clarifies the position of this office relative to assisting our local communities. Please feel free to contact me with any questions. Sincerely, David DeChristofaro."

I just wanted to put that out there that this was how this was going to work and get that on the record.

If there's no other correspondence, we will move on to public remarks. If you have something, go ahead and raise your hand, and I'll call on you.

MS. HOUSEL:

I guess me.

MAYOR WOODWARD:

Come on up to the microphone.

MS. HOUSEL:

Oh, man. I don't do public speaking very well.

MAYOR WOODWARD:

Just look at me.

MS. HOUSEL:

Okay.

MAYOR WOODWARD:

We need your name and address for the record.

MS. HOUSEL:

Okay. Brittany HouseL. I live at 3781 Boston Avenue, Warren, Ohio. Ultimately, I am the President of our Lordstown Baseball and Softball Organization, their recreational aspect of it. And we were just wondering what it would take for us to be able to open up our parks for a tournament, through either just recreational tournaments for Lordstown baseball and softball to be able to hold them, or travel tournaments to be able to come and hold them. Travel tournaments ultimately bring in a lot of money to the organizations and the villages. And we're just trying to look to build our organization. Because if we don't build it, it's just going to—everybody is just going to go and not want to play anymore. I just wanted to know what it would take to be able to bring tournaments into our village.

MAYOR WOODWARD:

Martin, do you have any thoughts or opinions?

MR. NELDER:

I know when the Pony leagues were here, Council had to vote on that. It was up to them to decide. Then we helped out once they got the okay.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Okay. So the Parks Department could prepare the fields—
MR. NELDER: Sure.
MAYOR WOODWARD: —and things like that. Do you want that to go to a committee?
MR. BLANK: Through the Parks.
MAYOR WOODWARD: Lamar. Does everybody just want to vote on it now?
MR. BLANK: You can't vote tonight. You need legislation and everything else. We used to charge so much a field.
MAYOR WOODWARD: Oh, you're going to charge for it.
MR. BLANK: We don't do it for free. They have to take care of the garbage, the bathrooms.
MAYOR WOODWARD: I didn't think about that.
MR. NELDER: They had to carry special insurance, too, for the tournaments.
MAYOR WOODWARD: We did?
MR. NELDER: No, the baseball associations. Some of them donated stuff to do the fields. Like, they helped bring machines in to do the fields. So that was one plus for us.
MS. HOUSEL: I know typically the travel organization, they pay—like, there's an entrance fee to come into the park for parking for all of the parents, like a \$10 fee for you to park and enter the fields. I also know there is a charge for each team to join. It could be up to \$450 a team to join the tournament. And I know that they often pay to rent the fields and they pay for the equipment that they use. Like, they bring in their own lime and everything like that.
MR. NELDER: And I believe they helped to pay some of the wages to help, too. There was something like that.
MR. BOWEN: Can you provide us with some sort of an information sheet of everything you just said they do?
MS. HOUSEL: Uh-huh.
MR. BOWEN: To help us better understand what our requirements are and what the tournament requirements are.
MS. HOUSEL: Absolutely.
MAYOR WOODWARD: Estimate it.
MS. HOUSEL: Okay.
MAYOR WOODWARD: Like I'm thinking estimate it, how profitable it is. Is there anything else that you guys would like to see?
MS. BLANK: Yeah, do you guys open the concession stand there? Not when we're there. We've got a screaming two—year old.
MS. HOUSEL: Oh, for T-Ball?
MS. BLANK: Not T-Ball, 7U.
MS. HOUSEL: Oh, 7U. We typically open it.
MS. BLANK: I come with a lot of snacks.
MS. HOUSEL: It's just one guy that runs it. He'll be in LA this whole week, so he won't be opened, except for Wednesday. We will be open on Wednesday. I'm opening it.
MAYOR WOODWARD: Yeah, I guess concessions would go if you hold tournaments.
MR. MOSELEY: Do you cook like Tod?
MS. HOUSEL: What was that?
MR. MOSELEY: Is Tod going to be there?
MS. HOUSEL: For the tournaments?
MR. MOSELEY: Wednesday.
MS. HOUSEL: No, just me. You just get me.
MR. MOSELEY: So, what, are you just going to pass out hard candy?
MS. HOUSEL: What was that?

MR. MOSELEY: Nothing.
MS. HOUSEL: I'm a better cook than him.
(Laughter.)
MR. MOSELEY: I have a question. Hey, Brent, didn't they have problems one year when they had all that going on? A bunch of fights.
CHIEF MILHOAN: I remember when the Pony Nationals—is that what you're referring to?
MR. MOSELEY: Yeah.
CHIEF MILHOAN: I remember when the Pony Nationals were going on, the agreement that all you guys talked about, I remember, I believe, it was a million-dollar insurance coverage. There were requirements that the Village said that they had to have. And they fulfilled those requirements but they also—the Pony Nationals because of the number of teams and the people that were going to be there—they actually paid security to work the games. I do not recall a number of fights up there. I'm not saying there wasn't any.
MR. MOSELEY: Yeah, I thought I heard they had some problems up there.
CHIEF MILHOAN: I think they had some typical issues with complaints about an umpire's call or something like that. It got a little bit vocal. But I don't remember it every being physical. I think there were a couple people that were asked to leave the park or the umpire threw them out of the game type of thing. I do not recall any physical altercations.
MAYOR WOODWARD: You have that now with the leagues.
MS. HOUSEL: I probably have it right now. To be honest, there's probably a situation going on right now. I mean, ultimately, I had to call the cops to remove parents who wanted to beat up an umpire in the parking lot. It's just how baseball goes.
CHIEF MILHOAN: Unfortunately, that's not unusual.
MS. HOUSEL: Yeah.
CHIEF MILHOAN: And it doesn't matter where you're at. It's not just here.
MR. BLANK: Someone was here three or four years ago, and Council said no to outside tournaments. That's all I'm saying.
MR. SHEELY: Wasn't that some kind of different league or something that they wanted—
MR. BLANK: They wanted tournaments. It wasn't Lordstown.
MR. SHEELY: No, it was coming from Warren someplace.
MR. BLANK: Leavittsburg.
MR. LIMING: Yeah.
MAYOR WOODWARD: So would this be the Lordstown Little League hosting the tournaments?
MS. HOUSEL: I mean, we would like to host a tournament. But I've also had two travel organizations reach out to me, too, to present it to you and ask if they could possibly rent our fields to use our fields. We do have a very nice setup. I mean, ultimately, we have a perfect setup for a tournament at our parks.
MAYOR WOODWARD: The fields are all—
MS. HOUSEL: And you can watch every game from one area. Both of my kids play travel, so I've been to plenty of fields and organizations and things like that.
MAYOR WOODWARD: So, this is going to come through your committee?
MR. LIMING: Yes, and I'm going to put Ernie in charge. He's the baseball guy. I don't know anything about it. He's going to be the lead on this.

MS. HOUSEL: I just know that four years ago when I took over, there were only 64 kids in our organization, and now we have 102. So we just want to keep building and building now. It's pretty much what we want to do. And if we can't host tournaments, then we're just going to be just like any other league.

MAYOR WOODWARD: You're going to stay the same.

MS. HOUSEL: Yeah, we're just going to stay the same size. Nobody is going to be, like, oh, I want to go play for Lordstown. You know what I mean? So, that's all.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Okay. We'll work on that.

MS. HOUSEL: Okay, thank you.
