And the other thing that I have is that I wanted to share with everybody that it looks like Senator Sherrod Brown has written a request to support—this is a letter to President Joe Biden, also to the Secretary of Defense and the Secretary of the Navy. He was writing to request the support of the Bartlett Maritime Corporation's proposal to construct and operate submarine component repair facilities in Lordstown and Lorain, Ohio, and to urge him to quickly direct resources from recently passed national security supplemental to Bartlett Maritime Corporation to accelerate delayed submarine maintenance. Just wanted to share with everybody that this seems to be gaining traction, and we may be looking for some action on that soon.

MS. BORDNER: Thank you, Mayor. Community Reinvestment Area and Enterprise Zone abatement review season is over, and I have also reviewed everything with Kathy in the Tax Department. So, I want to share that Anderson DuBose has only the balance on its ten year, 75 percent abatement related to the addition, which they put on their building in 2017, remaining. That expires in 2027. The original, main abatement has expired and with that, so has the requirement that the Village share income taxes collected with the school. So, I just wanted to let everyone know that on this particular, original abatement, which was also for ten years, 75 percent, the Village paid the school district a total of \$551,067 of the shared taxes.

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- SOLICITOR RIES: Mayor, I have two pieces of correspondence here. The first one is from Terry and Rhonda Smith. "Good morning. I would like to start by saying that I definitely am in favor of having traffic cameras in the school zone. My concern is what happens when the vehicles leave the school zone? I can tell you as of now, they are hammering the throttle and flying by our house. We live at 6055 Tod Avenue, right across from the plaza. It is just ridiculous the speeds that they are going past our house. The worst times are about 6 a.m. and 3 p.m. The Police Departments does a nice job of being visible at times. But we know what happens when you see a police presence, everyone is on the straight and narrow. My wife and I would like to offer you and your staff an open invitation to come and sit in our driveway during either of these times so you can witness this first hand. Thank you for your time and we look forward to hearing from you. Terry and Rhonda Smith."
- The second piece of correspondence, "Dear Mayor Woodward: During the early hours of May 20, my wife was suffering an extended occurrence of AFib heart rate. She was weak and needed to go to the emergency room. I called 911 specifying Lordstown ambulance, if possible. The response time was excellent. Carlie Jackson and her fellow paramedic (did not get his name) did a great job of helping her down the stairs and into the ambulance and attending to her before transporting her to Trumbull Memorial's ER. It means so much to have such a wonderful service in my hometown. Thank you. Bill Cottrill" as stated May 29, 2024.

Because I live on Tod Avenue, too, and I agree with the lady that wrote in. It's unbelievable sometimes the way they fly down that road. You know, because they're coming down over the hill. And then there's a sign right above my driveway that says slow down, school zone or something. So they just slam on those jake brakes when they see that. So, I just wondered if there's a ratio of the speeding tickets.

CHIEF MILHOAN: Breaking down between the cars and trucks, you would have to look at every individual stopped. I don't know if in our system there's a way of separating them. We can tell you how many citations were written, but you'd have to go through them individually to determine whether they were a truck, car, motorcycle.

MR. BLANK: From Finance Committee for Emergency Passage, **AN ORDINANCE BANNING THE CULTIVATION, DISTRIBUTION, PROCESSING, AND SALE OF RECREATIONAL MARIJUANA AND/OR ADULT USE CANNABIS WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF LORDSTOWN AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.**

SOLICITOR RIES: Absolutely. Just to be clear, this Ordinance does not ban the use of recreational marijuana within the Village of Lordstown. It bans—and I quote—"Recreational marijuana and/or adult-use cannabis cultivators, dispensaries, processors and retailers." When the State of Ohio decriminalized recreational marijuana, they specifically created a provision that allowed the Village to do this. And then they went so far as to say you can't ban the actual use of recreational marijuana. And that's not what we are doing here. There's nowhere in this Ordinance that says the use itself is banned.

MR. BOND: It does allow for the cultivation for your own use?

SOLICITOR RIES: Yes, so under the Ohio Revised Code, there's another exception there for home-grown use. You can have up to six plants per individual or 12 plants for two individuals 21 years or older living in the same residence. And the Ordinance doesn't even address that because there's no reason to. It only bans the commercial sale.

MR. BOND: Thank you.
