Unfortunately, I have a report. With the heavy rains and the MR. HICKOX:

snow over the past two weeks, it seems like we've had three

different incidents, as far as events. We've dealt with

drainage issues and sinkholes at various locations. And we're

still fighting with some of them, especially after today. Personally, I'd like to thank Mark Holton at Holton Excavating for his help, advice and use of some of his

equipment on the massive sinkhole that we had up on Bacher Road. Also, the Trumbull County Engineer's office for their

equipment and help in the same location.

In other business, the chapel door that we ordered last year

has finally been replaced.

Weather permitting, we'll continue patching potholes, as

needed.

On another note, at the end of the last meeting, Terry mentioned that we're going to be taking our loader in for some repairs. We scheduled Lo-Boy to come and get it, and before they got here—we were intending on taking it to Ohio CAT—the estimate doubled before we got it there. So we didn't go there. We've got another price now and have got the county lined up to haul that. We're going to take it Thursday and we're going to get started to work on that.

Where is it going? MR. LIMING:

The gentleman who used to do the work for us, he's got a MR. HICKOX:

shop in Canfield. I don't know the name of it.

MR. CAMPBELL: And the price is going to be the same as we got to begin

Yes, in fact, maybe a little less even. MR. HICKOX:

> I know myself and Terry, and I think there were other councilmen that have gotten some phone calls. They started the first of the year on paving and what we intend to do. Some of it is in the developments. Some of it is on some

of the roads. Just making you aware that the calls are

coming in.

At one of our committee meetings after the first of the year, we talked about finding grants and funding and if any of the other surrounding communities would be interested in going in with us on some of these. The one that I did get a response from is Warren Township. Apparently, we've tried

he thought twice, maybe three times—to get a grant through the OPWC for Hewitt-Gifford Road. They still are

on board with that if we want to pursue it. For the OPWC grants, that's something that we've got about three weeks to get applied for. I know all the engineering has been done. The most recent I know of is 2019 or 2020 that I've seen. With all these heavy rain issues that we've had, we've got some off-road ditching that we have to address. I just need to know whose blessing I need before we go. These are all off-road ditches that we've done in the past, previous to me. We just need to clean them back up again if that's the direction you wish to head. And that's all I have.

MAYOR HILL: Bill, do you know who we went through if it's off road? Do

we have to get releases from property owners?

MR. BLANK: We never did in the past. I didn't know we went off road. If

we did, we never got anything.

MAYOR HILL: Are the ditches in the right-of-way?

MR. HICKOX: No, private property. One of them, in particular, is in the

Space Center.

MR. BOND: Are these old township or county ditches?

MR. HICKOX: No, not that I know of.

MR. CAMPBELL: There's one that I can remember when I was on the Police

Department, it's right behind the church off of Palmyra and it goes into the Space Center. The guy that used to be the teacher—I forget his name—complained a lot and finally the Village finally did go in there and clean it up, but that's been

a while back.

MR. RADTKA: Dick Bell?

MR. HICKOX: That's one of the same ditches.

MAYOR HILL: The only thing I got is I did get a call from the

Superintendent of the schools today. He said they still have an open purchase order for doing the ball fields. I believe last year we had an agreement with them. They were going to go with half the ball fields. They just said bring it up and find out whenever we were going to do it. I gave it to Ron, and Ron said as soon as the place dries out, he'll get it done

and just send the school an invoice.

MR. HICKOX: We did start it last year and then the rains came and other

projects showed up and we never did get back to it. We have two of the fields done and the other two we'll try again for

this year.

MAYOR HILL: And they've had a lot of calls at the school about walking

and things like that. He said he's not going to worry about it this year. But next fall he'd like to get with the Village and see what they want to do as far as if they want to open up the walking through the schools again. I know there's discussion that they have custodians and maybe they can monitor that.

Get that going again.

They said they had some of the equipment which we had bought in the back that they had some issues with. He said he knew nothing about it. He said he had told the parties he said we had some equipment that was broke. He said they got in touch with the people who we bought the equipment from and he had them come in, and everything is up and running like it should be. Any issues they had with it, they fixed it. He said they realize that we, as a village, had put a lot of money into that and they had put some money into it,

too. He said if we decide to go back to letting residents use that, everything is in good condition. He just gave me a call
