MAYOR WOODWARD: 10 a.m. Monday, May 26. I will not be there, but it is in capable hands. Thank you to Martin and Chris Peterson in advance for putting that together for us.
Tonight we're going to have four summer help appointments. I'll be asking for those tonight, also. That is all I have.
Clerk's report?

MR. BLANK: I'd just like to say that next Tuesday, the 27th, will be our Finance meeting, 6:00.
I'd also like to bring up that legislation has always been that it's supposed to be to the Solicitor no later than Wednesday. This piece came in late, and that's not the Solicitor's fault. This seems to be happening more and more. So, any legislation needs to be to the Solicitor's office in the morning on Wednesdays.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Wednesday morning, okay.

MR. BLANK: Yes.

MAYOR WOODWARD: All right. Solicitor's report?

SOLICITOR RIES: No report, Mayor.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Treasurer's report?

MR. EBLING: No report.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Board of Trustees of Public Affairs report?

MR. PETERSON: Yes, Mayor. Thank you. Our next regular meeting is tomorrow at 4 p.m. In addition to that, we are continuing to work with Verdantas on the 24-inch air release. Chris will have more information on that.
Our annual hydrant flushing will begin next month.
And we're starting to go around and do our annual checks at the grinder pumps.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Does anybody have any questions for Chris?
(NO RESPONSE FROM COUNCIL.)
All right. We'll move on. Village Engineer's report?

MR. KOGELNIK: Yes, Mayor. I distributed my report to you all. Last week was a heavy lift on the existing 24-inch waterline. We did the pressure reading on all nine new air release valves, and we can see, based on our models, that between State Route 45 booster station and in front of the Admin building here, approximately, which is air release valve number one, there might be a problem. So we're honing in on that problem. We don't know what the problem is yet, but we will get to it and will apprise the Village of that.
The other thing on that project, that air release valve number four and number five, those are both located, I think, just east of the railroad track. We found that the valve bodies, the new valve bodies cracked. Evidently, the bolts holding the cap onto the body were overtightened by the manufacturer. Those are under warranty and being replaced. So that is pretty much the bulk of what we were working on in the past couple weeks. Does anybody have any questions for me?

MR. MOSELEY: So what will you do? Tear that valve apart, the number one?

MR. KOGELNIK: Well, we don't know if it's at number one. It's in between number one and the water booster station, which there's probably a good 1,500/2,000 feet there. So we're going to have to home in on that area. We don't know where exactly that's at, otherwise, I'd be telling you.

MR. BLANK: Yes, Bill?
Chris, I just had a concern about the invoice for you and for the rest of their work, but now this might be held up for their end.

MR. KOGELNIK: Yeah, I'll double-check that for you, Bill.

MR. BLANK: I just don't want to wait three months so we can get reimbursed.

MR. KOGELNIK: Right. And I think the first payment application for the contractor is on the docket, right?

MR. BLANK: Right.

MR. KOGELNIK: Yes, Bob?

MR. BOND: Yes, when you say "hone in on it," what could the potential problem be? If it's between them, how do you intend to find that?

MR. KOGELNIK: Well, it could be a closed valve but in that location, I don't believe we have any valves. And it could be something directly at the booster station where the booster station is not drawing a negative suction like it should. And, so, we have some homework to do. I don't know what it is but we were hoping it would be something as simple as a partially closed valve. We did all sorts of pressure gauge readings, and I was really, really looking for a substantial pressure drop. I did not find that, Bob, which that's good news in itself but I'm just telling you all I could see in the data.

MR. BOND: Thank you.

MR. KOGELNIK: Yes. Thank you very much.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Special reports. Police Chief Brent Milhoan?

CHIEF MILHOAN: Yes, Mayor. Just to update all of you. Back on June 20th of 2023, I had informed you that our officers had made a traffic stop and seized a large amount of cash. For those of you that may not have been here or may not remember, basically, what happened is our officers were attempting to make a traffic stop when the individual pulled into a driveway here in Lordstown in an effort to evade the officers. Ironically, the driveway that the individual pulled into is one of our officer's house, and it happened to be our K9 officer's house. So, the officers had a brief conversation with the suspect, felt that there was possibly drugs in the vehicle. Since we were already in K9 Blank's driveway, we contacted him and he and his partner did an open-air search of the vehicle. The dog alerted on the vehicle, which gave the officers probable cause to search. They did find drugs in the vehicle, along with just shy of \$20,000. Due to the fact that we were looking at drug trafficking charges, our officers confiscated the money, contacted the Drug Enforcement Agency and worked with them in an effort to confiscate and seize the funds. It took, obviously, almost two years, but I'm happy to report that after DEA takes approximately 20 percent of their cut for their involvement in the case, that left us with \$15,568.80. So, basically, one traffic stop paid for our dog. That's all I have.

MR. BLANK: Not biased, but way to go Jochie.

Also, I'd like to thank Council for letting us purchase the new salt truck at the Road Department. We received the truck Monday of last week. We're waiting on the plow and the salt spreader, but it will be coming. It's a well needed truck, so I wanted to thank you. That's it.

MAYOR WOODWARD: The old truck, we're swapping out a truck, right?

MR. NELDER: They didn't want to give us much of a trade in, so we had planned on putting it on Gov.deals.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Okay, and how soon will that happen?

MR. NELDER: I'd like to wait until we receive the plow, the new one, then we can get rid of the old one.

MAYOR WOODWARD: Okay. Does anybody have any questions for Martin?

MR. BOWEN: Not a question but I just want to thank—and pass this along to the Steves over there at the park. The work they do for the Lordstown baseball teams is crazy and we really appreciate it because they go through and do a lot of work. I wanted to thank them.

The interesting thing about that lunch, and I can see the faces of the three people I'm almost sure of the dozen, 15 people that attend each day, that's the only meal that they eat each day.

We've also taken on supplying, providing a lunch to shut ins. So, currently people who are or were involved with our center that can't get out, we deliver lunches to them those four days. I want you to know that but also anybody that knows a resident that has trouble getting food, you know, please contact us and we'll put them on the list. It's no charge. So that's it.

I doubt they hardly even have water for that. I don't think anybody up here heard anything about this beforehand or not. I didn't know. I received it in my mailbox this morning. Thank you.
